Welcome back! I hope that your first few weeks of school have gone swimmingly. Mercifully, with a major election in November lawmakers at the state and federal level are too busy campaigning to push any terrible legislation.

The deadline to register to vote in Ohio for November's General Election is October 7th. Use this link to get registered if you're not already.

A win for teachers? That doesn't sound right, but it is in fact the case. After the Republican supermajority in the Ohio General Assembly refused to fully fund the state school board it looked like the money was going to come from an increase in teacher licensure fees. The Office of Budget and Management's Controlling Board allocated emergency funds to prevent the money from coming from the pockets of teachers.

Politics or Reality? It is not simply divisive political rhetoric to suggest that only one of the viable options for President supports public schools. The Republican Party has already shown their hand in Ohio, and Project 2025 illustrates that a second Trump administration would seek to take nationally the culture war attacks on teachers, dramatically decrease funding of underresourced public schools, the elimination of Head Start, and the expansion of privatization tactics like universal vouchers. In its most diabolical promise, the plan would eliminate the federal Department of Education and threaten to eliminate all Title I funding.

On the other hand, a Harris/Walz administration seeks to fully fund Special Education mandates for the first time, create universal pre-K, renew the child tax credit, assure the ability to teach truth related to history and race, protect LGBTQ+ and other marginalized kids, and expand funding for school breakfasts and lunches. As should be obvious, the NEA and AFT have endorsed the Democrats.
